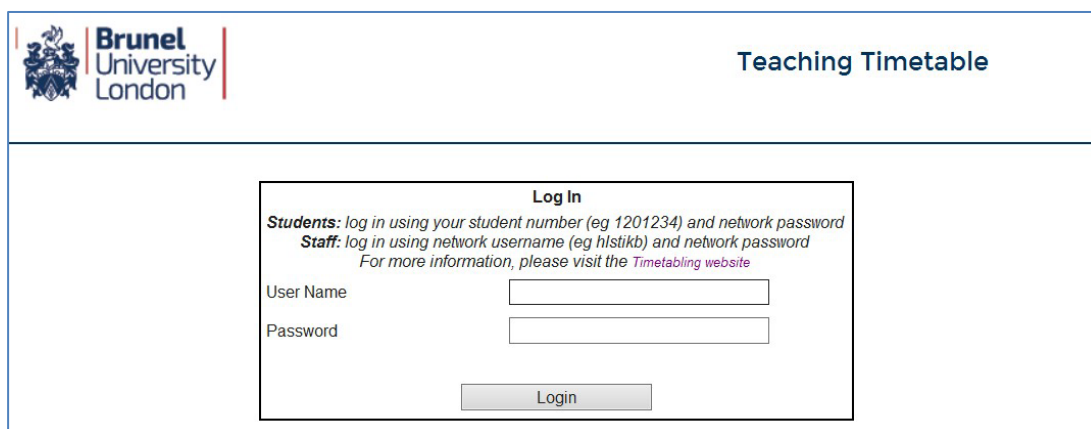


# TAG Guide – Timetable Triage

### 6. Use “Module Timetable”; when you click “View Timetable”:

**If the timetable is blank, or if modules or activities are missing:**

Click “Go back” at the bottom of the page and ensure you have selected:

\* Your modules (control click to select them all);

\* This week, Next week or Term 1;
